Restarting Tourism in the Maldives



A Brief

With the Maldives to reopen its borders for tourists, the Ministry of Tourism, in consultation with health professionals and industry stakeholders, has prepared a Guideline for Restarting Tourism in Maldives, outlining the measures that need to be followed to ensure the safety of tourists and residents.

In this publication, we have summarised the Guideline in the perspective of:

- △ **Tourists:** covering procedures in place from the port of entry to departure.
- △ **Tourist Establishments:** covering the general requirements for all tourist establishments and support businesses and the specific requirements for guesthouses and foreign vessels.





Special Considerations




Maintain physical distancing of at least 1 meter

Install "Trace Ekee" application upon or before arrival at the Maldives

Tourist Establishment's Perspective

Minimum Standards and General Procedures applicable to all tourist establishments and support businesses.





Before Operation Starts

After Operation Starts

- △ Guest rooms to be used for isolation/ quarantine have to be designated as per HPA standards.
- △ Staff serving guests have to be trained for the use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and disinfection procedures.
- △ Emergency procedures must be formulated and staff trained accordingly.
- △ Health and safety plan has to be submitted to the Ministry of Tourism prior to reopening.
- △ Special requirements for staff returning to work from abroad/inhabited islands will be applied.

- △ Guest rooms to be used for isolation/ quarantine have to be maintained as per HPA standards.
- △ Adequate stock of PPE must be maintained.
- △ Disinfection and decontamination procedures to be followed at vessels and guest rooms after each trip or use.
- △ Frequently contaminated surfaces and common areas must be subject to regular disinfection.
- △ Obligation to bear transfer and accommodation costs of positive guests to Government Isolation Facilities.
- △ Airport representatives commuting between inhabited islands and airports will be restricted from travelling to resorts.

Special Rules



Guesthouses

- △ To be opened to receive tourists starting from 1 August (tentatively).
- △ Isolation in cases of symptomatic or positive cases to be arranged at guest rooms.
- △ Food and beverage services to be arranged within the premises.
- △ Resident doctor on the island to have undergone HPA certified training on COVID-19 management.
- △ Contact tracing of the guests to be maintained.
- △ Health and Safety Plan has to be submitted to MOT for approval prior to restarting.



Foreign Vessels

- △ Exempted from the Guideline and to follow International Maritime

 Organization Regulations and Guidelines.
- △ Will be allowed to disembarkpassengers on inhabited islands from1 August onwards.
- △ Access to international airports, under specific requirements, allowed from 15 July onwards Screening measures will be conducted at first port of clearance.
- △ Associated costs for isolation or treatment at a Government Isolation Facility have to be borne by the vessel's agent or operator of the vessel.
